Reaching out to families during the pandemic

We continue to support The Elizabeth Foundation's *Let's Listen and Talk* programme for deaf babies and toddlers.



The online, interactive programme helps parents to develop their child's listening, speaking and communication skills. The service has been incredibly important during the pandemic because it has reached families in the home.

Our grant has enabled The Elizabeth Foundation to employ a new Teacher of the Deaf (ToD) for one and half days per week to deliver the project. Parents have reported that the teacher's guidance has motivated them to stay on track: 'The support of our ToD has meant that families feel less isolated or overwhelmed at home and, as one parent told us recently "means that I don't feel like giving up!",' says Karen Vaughan, Deputy Chief Executive of The Elizabeth Foundation.

Demand for the *Let's Listen and Talk programme* is growing, with referrals coming from hospital audiology departments and cochlear implant centres as well as word of mouth. The service is helping the families of children with a variety of needs: *'We have seen more families with deaf children who have needs relating to Auditory Neuropathy Spectrum Disorder, Downs syndrome, microtia, atresia and immune deficiencies seeking our support, and telling us that without the programme they would simply "feel lost",* 'says Karen.

In order to reach as many families as possible during the pandemic, The Elizabeth Foundation have waived all fees, providing free access to their home learning and support programme.

Since then, we have funded the refurbishment of their music suite and library, and added two sensory rooms for children with multi-sensory impairments.
